Top Ten Health Deficiencies and Helpful Hints to Avoid Them (Deficiency numbers for RO V from FY13)

1. F323 FREE OF ACCIDENT HAZARDS/SUPERVISION/DEVICES

- Failure to provide the necessary care and services to prevent falls. This includes failure
 to implement safety interventions, provide adequate supervision and/or safety devices
 to provide for safe transfers, modifying interventions as necessary and training of staff.
- Failure to prevent resident elopement.
- Failure to provide supervision to prevent resident accessibility to hazardous chemicals.
- Failure to maintain safe water temperatures.
- Failure to assess a resident's capability to smoke safely and to provide appropriate supervision or other safety measures.
- Failure to assess side rail safety.
- Failure to supervise residents to prevent altercations.

2. F441 INFECTION CONTROL, PREVENT SPREAD/LINENS

- Failure to follow current standards of practice related to proper hand hygiene.
- Failure to implement and maintain an effective Infection Control Surveillance Program.
- Failure to properly disinfect glucometer between resident use.
- Failure to follow proper isolation precautions.
- Failure to implement proper infection control practices during resident care such as wound or catheter care.

3. F309 PROVIDE CARE/SERVICES FOR HIGHEST WELL BEING

- Failure to properly manage resident's pain.
- Failure to provide the necessary care and services for non-pressure related skin ulcers and/or wound, end-of-life (hospice) services and dialysis.

4. F 371 SANITARY CONDITIONS

- Failure to label and date opened foods in the refrigerator and freezer.
- Failure to monitor dishwasher temperatures, refrigerator and freezer temperatures.
- Failure to maintain appropriate sanitizing solution used in the kitchen.
- Failure to air dry pots and pans prior to storage.

- Failure to maintain safe serving temperatures of foods on the tray line.
- Failure to use proper hand hygiene during preparation and serving of food.
- Failure to wear proper hair restraint in the kitchen.

5. F 329 UNNECESSARY DRUGS

- Failure to ensure residents are free from:
 - O Excessive dose (includes duplicative therapy),
 - Excessive duration,
 - Without adequate monitoring,
 - O Without adequate indication for use,
 - In the presence of adverse consequences which indicate dosage should be reduced or discontinued.
- Failure to adequately monitor behaviors during the time a resident is receiving psychoactive medication(s) (antipsychotics, hypnotics, antidepressants, mood stabilizers and anxiolytics.)
- Failure to ensure that residents are not given antipsychotic medication unless antipsychotic drug therapy is necessary is necessary to treat a specific diagnosed condition.
- Failure to attempt periodic gradual dose reductions (for any medication.)
- Failure to initiate non-pharmacological interventions prior to or in conjunction with medication use.
- Failure to monitor antibiotic therapy.
- Failure to monitor anticoagulant therapy.
- Failure to monitor for excessive dosage of Acetaminophen.

6. ABUSE PREVENTION

- Failure to report alleged violations of abuse including injuries of unknown source, misappropriation of resident property, resident-to-resident or staff to resident altercations.
- Failure to conduct a thorough and timely investigation of any allegation of abuse.
- Failure to immediately report allegations of abuse to the Administrator and State
 Agency. This includes failure to report prior to the facility conducting its investigation.

7. F314 PRESSURE ULCERS

- Failure to assess pressure ulcer risk and implement appropriate preventive measures.
- Failure to promote healing of pressure ulcers and prevent new pressure ulcers from developing. This includes failure to conduct timely and thorough assessments, have

appropriate treatment orders and implement individualized pressure ulcer prevention plans.

- Failure to properly and consistently implement physician orders for wound care.
- Failure to turn and reposition the resident according to their individualized assessment.
- Failure to prevent infection or deterioration of existing pressure ulcers.

8. F 279 Comprehensive Care Plans

• Failure to develop a comprehensive care plan based on the resident's RAI. Examples include (but are not limited to) pressure ulcers, falls or manage behaviors.

9. F 226 ABUSE (DEVELOPMENT AND OPERATIONALIZATION OF POLICY)

- Failure to operationalize the facility's abuse policy.
- Failure to operationalize the requirements of the Elder Justice Act ("Reasonable Suspicion of a Crime") including the required posting and training of staff.
- Failure to develop and operationalize an abuse policy that specifies "immediate" reporting.

10. F282 SERVICES BY QUALIFIED PERSONS

- Failure to follow individualized interventions as specified in resident's plans of care.
- Failure to provide qualified staff to implement the residents' plan of care.
- Failure to follow physician orders in accordance with the residents plan of care
