I. Introductions/Review Agenda/Meeting Goals

II. LeadingAge Wisconsin's 2013-2015 Legislative Agenda:

- Seek return of the bed tax skim and use revenues to fund the goal of lowering the Wisconsin nursing home per resident daily loss to the national average (from \$41.13 to \$19.55). *LeadingAge Wisconsin is updating the MA loss data by Senate District.*
- Support legislation authorizing a nursing home drug formulary.
- Preserve the property tax exemption for non-profit retirement homes for the aged.
- Accept legislation (if necessary) to allow nursing home arbitration agreements only if the agreements are voluntary, not part of the admissions agreement (separate with different font and colored paper), and may be rescinded within 30 days. {Major issue is support for maintaining the 2011 Wisconsin Act 2 health and long-term care tort reform protections.}
- Support maintaining the current nursing home bed cap and moratorium, *including the process regarding the relocation of beds by owning corporations (the relocation issue may be reconsidered if legislation moves forward).* Modify current provisions to allow facilities to place beds in "restricted use status" for an indefinite period. Restricted use beds could be activated with a 12-month notice to DHS (i.e., beds banked or in restricted use would be retained for possible later use by the owner. No bed tax would be levied on these beds}.
- Allow the use of remote monitoring technology by Adult Family Homes (rule change: <u>www.leadingagewi.org/sites/default/files/remotetech.pdf</u>).
- Updates received from the Governor's Budget Staff and DHS officials.
- In addition to those discussed above, should LeadingAge Wisconsin establish additional state legislative priorities for the 2013-2015 legislative session? Further, how will the LeadingAge Wisconsin non-nursing home providers receive future rate increases under the Family Care and Partnership programs? What options should be considered? III. DHS Proposed Nursing Home Quality Performance Measurement System

- DHS is pursuing a nursing home quality performance measurement system. The staff at the Center for Health Systems Research and Analysis (CHSRA) is providing the technical staffing and support for this project. (see: www.leadingagewi.org/sites/default/files/chsrareport.pdf).
- DHS intends to, "....produce a nursing home quality performance measurement system that has been tested for credibility and is ready for statewide implementation. The ultimate outcome of this initiative is to improve clinical outcomes for residents, which will also improve their quality of life."
- LeadingAge Wisconsin assumes the final performance metrics developed by DHS also will be reflected in future pay-for-performance systems employed by the Department.
- The DHS nursing home quality performance measurement system is expected to be finalized by October 2013. CHSRA will:

- Research nursing home performance data sources and measures, including experiences/concerns of those currently using these data sources and measures.
- Solicit Wisconsin nursing home stakeholder input in the process of defining, testing, implementing and managing a nursing home performance measurement system.
- Design prototype of such a system and test it for statistical validity, reliability and credibility.
- Present a successfully tested, data-driven nursing home clinical performance measurement system ready for statewide implementation. A final report summarizing the system will be delivered no later than October 30, 2013.

 - Convert Nursing Facility Beds to Assisted Living Beds for PACE Enrollees
